

This tells of Little Bee who has red, white and blue stripes! They meet Her Majesty The Queen and she lets their colours shine during her summer Platinum Jubilee celebrations.

Now, Iona has self-published 'Jubilee Bee and The King's Christmas Present.' In this story, Jubilee misses their friend The Queen and Christmas makes their grief worse. Then, King Charles III invites Jubilee to a Christmas meeting and asks Jubilee to help him spread the word about climate change. In deciding what would be best for the King's Christmas present, Jubilee learns what the most important ingredients for a Christmas present are. This book also contains information pages about Christmas and a quiz!

"I felt really nervous of self-publishing," Iona says, 'but after watching several supportive YouTube videos, I thought I should be brave and try. It's exciting and nerve wracking to see my stories in print! I wanted my books to be meaningful and so they cover issues such as individuality, historic events, bereavement, saving bees, climate change and the value of gifts made with love and care. I hope that anyone who buys my books enjoys them and want to thank you so much for your support at the start of my publishing journey. I hope that as I continue to self-publish, the quality of my books will get better and better."

The picture, featuring a line drawing of Buckingham Palace, showed a rainbow appearing as it did on the day of The Queen's death and a lone Corgi looking back at the Palace. Initially drawn as a mark of respect at a sad time for The Nation, Jackie posted the drawing on her social media, allowing others to do the same. However, when asked for prints of the picture, she decided to sell them to raise money for local charities including £200 for St Giles Hospice and £200 for Tamworth Wellbeing Cancer Support Centre.

do something positive after such a sad
occasion. I wanted to show my respect
for The Queen in my own way by drawing
the picture and to be able to support local
charities too has been amazing."
